

THE PROJECT

There is no doubt that the wine sector is very important for the Mediterranean region on several levels: economic, social and environmental. This last aspect is the main focus of OENOMED.

Consuming increasingly green, puts pressure on wine producers, to add more sustainability as evidenced by the growing demand for biodynamic, organic wines, etc.

MSMEs in the sector must meet this challenge if they want to remain competitive, especially if we assume that they will not be able to compete in volume with large wineries.

OENOMED intends to help wine MSMEs to switch to green practices and exploit the unique natural resources of the Mediterranean Protected Areas. These areas have enormous potential that requires green and ecofriendly enterprises.

The project will strengthen the MSMEs both technically and economically, preparing them for growth by using the wine quality labels developed by the partners of the Protected Areas concerned.

The project started on 17 November 2020 and will end on 16 november 2023.

To qualify and promote MSMEs in the wine sector in Mediterranean Protected Areas by enhancing the uniqueness of these areas and promoting the adoption of green techniques, sustainable business practices and joint business strategies.
