Promotion of an innovative collaborative circular economy system for waste separation, reuse, & marketing involving the community, local organisations, & Beitillu village council, including the development of a digital system to facilitate waste management and quantification into incentives or rewards at the village council to encourage participation and sustainability.



- 1 compactor truck for the collection & transfer of organic waste; 200 waste bins. 10 new jobs; **100** individuals trained. **2** awareness campaigns (1 community, 1 national).
- + Implementation of a Digital Collection System. + Improvement in financial performance of Beitillu Village Council + improving its capacity for partnerships with the private sector. + Revenue Stream for Agricultural Cooperative.



650 participants (over 100 households), including 95 women, 140 youth & 265 children **12500** beneficiaries (**4500** in Beitillu & around **8000** in the surrounding communities of Deir Ammar, Jammala, & Deir Ammar refugee camp).

MedTOWN project Co-producing social policies with Social Solidarity Economy actors to fight poverty, inequality and social exclusion is a cooperation project involving 9 partner organizations, led by Spanish NGO Assembly for cooperation for Peace & funded by the European Union under the ENI CBC Med Programme, from Sept 2019 to Nov 2023. Total budget €3,4 million, 86,5% EU contribution.
